Welcome to Worship at Resurrection Lutheran Church

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday. Lutherans believe and teach that our Lord gives His Body and Blood for the forgiveness of sin, strengthening of faith, and the promise of salvation. We understand we are sinners in need of forgiveness; and recognize the Body and Blood of Jesus are physically present in, with, and under the bread and wine in the sacrament. Thankful for His grace

and mercy, and for His rich blessings, we come in humility and trust to Holy Communion. Not sure what to do? Need to know more? Feel free to speak with the Pastor or the Elder of the day. They are generally available before or after worship service.

Communicants receive the Host in their palm. In distribution, both individual and common cup are offered. If you choose the common cup, please hold your hand in front of you until the chalice is offered. White grape juice is provided in the center of each tray for those who avoid wine for medical or recovery purposes. Gluten free wafers are available (speak to Pastor or an Elder before service to receive the Host in this form).

You are invited to remain seated in the pew (with your family if you wish) if distribution in this way is easier for you. Please notify an usher.

Hearing assistance devices and large print editions of the Lutheran Service Book (LSB) are available for use during the worship service. Please notify an usher should you need one.

As We Gather

The ending of a liturgical year speaks of the end of all things. Our Lord spoke plainly about the end of the world. There are signs the end is coming. Jesus' teaching seems to elicit only question marks on our part. "When?" "What?" "How?" The signs He speaks of include false teachers in the church, wars, rumors of wars, and earthquakes as "but the beginning of the birth pains" (Mark 13:8). The Jewish people of Jesus' time on earth would be alarmed at His prediction of the destruction of the temple as it would mean the end of their faith and hope in God. The world is to see, however, that the loving, saving God is closer than ever in the new temple of the flesh and blood of Jesus Christ, crucified and risen again for the life of the world. As the beloved hymn says, our "hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness." No merit of our own can prepare us "when darkness veils, . . . in every high and stormy gale, . . . in the raging flood; when every earthly prop gives way." No matter what comes we are "clothed in His righteousness alone, redeemed to stand before His throne! On Christ, the solid rock, I stand; all other ground is sinking sand" (LSB 575/576).



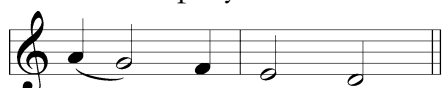
